Futuristic chauffeur launched in Goolwa

ELECTRIC cars are the way of the future and Alexandrina mayor Keith Parkes says the Fleurieu Peninsula is embracing the movement.

Hosting charging stations around the region has attracted economic chauffeur company myCar to introduce its luxury service along the South Coast.

On Tuesday, November 21, myCar launched its service in Goolwa with a showcase of one of the company's \$200,000 Tesla vehicles.

The futuristic car has

come along way since the DeLorean was launched in the 1980s – the only resemblance is the gull-wing doors mimicking an aircraft.

Mark Harrington from myCar said the company was utilising the charging infrastructure in place across the Fleurieu to offer VIP tours.

He said the Tesla vehicles were pure electric, running on renewable power.

"We're bringing VIP tourists through the region but we also have Mitsubishi outlanders that we will do tours with and commuter services

to the city," he said.

Mr Parkes said the service brings another set of vehicles to utilise the region's electric highway.

"The highway allows for these vehicles to be charged in any town across the Fleurieu and Kangaroo Island," he said.

"These vehicles are as environmentally friendly as you can get – beautiful and quiet, very economical and no emissions."

He said the service posed an opportunity for a boost in tourism.
